OBJECTIVES: Caregiver burden and distress are well documented in younger adults with traumatic brain injury (TBI) but not for elderly sustaining TBI (65 years and over). The objectives of this study were to: (1) describe subjective and objective burden and psychological symptoms (anxiety and depression) of close relatives of elderly persons with TBI four months post-injury, and (2) to explore if subjective burden is explained by age of the injured person, perceived social support, and subjective complaints relative to the injured elder.

METHODS: Participants were 36 relatives of elders with TBI aged between 29 and 84 years (mean age = 65.1u00b112.2; 89% women; 67% spouses living with the injured elder; 17% children). Elders with TBI were aged 65-90 years and were admitted to a Level I trauma centre in Quu00e9bec, Canada (25% mild, 47% complicated mild, and 28% moderate/severe TBI). The Zarit Burden Interview (ZBI) measured subjective burden. A checklist was used to assess objective burden (i.e., significant changes in activities or roles since the injury). Psychological symptoms of the close relative were assessed with the Hospital Anxiety and Depression Scale (HADS) using a cut-off >8 on either subscale to identify clinically significant symptoms. The participantu2019s perceived social support was measured with the Modified MOS Social Support scale. The Brain Injury Complaint Questionnaire (BICoQ) assessed a variety of problems and complaints observed by the relative regarding the injured person (e.g. memory, fatigue, motivation).

RESULTS: Twenty-nine percent of relatives presented mild-moderate subjective burden on the ZBI at 4 months post-injury and 6% presented moderate-severe burden. Almost all participants (87%) reported some form of objective burden (e.g. spending more time caring for their loved one or having less time for themselves). Regarding psychological symptoms, 17% of relatives presented significant depressive symptoms and 11% significant anxiety symptoms. In total 25% had either significant anxiety or depression. Subjective burden and psychological symptoms (total HADS) were strongly correlated ($r=.54$, p

Following severe brain injury the immediate concern is a simple one-- the survival of the patient. Subsequent prediction of the quality and extent of recovery becomes increasingly difficult. Although physical, e.g. sensory and motor, recovery dominates the first six months, psychological symptoms, which form the focus of this book gradually take precedence. These are of two main types: cognitive, with disturbances of memory, intellect, and information-processing; interpersonal/emotional, with disturbances of volition, emotional control, and behaviour. In this book the nature, severity, and management of deficits in these areas are examined in detail along with the fundamental pathophysiology of head injury, problems of measuring and defining outcome, its psychological and social consequences. The specific problems of head injuries to children are also discussed.
